U.S. AIR FORCE ACADEMY, Colo. — So you want to visit the Academy but don't feel like leaving home?

All you need is the internet, thanks to an interactive, 360-degree virtual tour the school launched May 1.

"Every potential cadet, family member, community member and general supporter gets an authentic, behind-the-scenes view of what the Academy is like," said Mike Peterson, the Academy's chief of outreach.

The tour can be taken with smartphones, computers, or via head-mounted display across the Gen. Benjamin O. Davis Jr. Airfield and through the remotely piloted aircraft center, the human performance lab, the Cadet Chapel, and nearly 50 other on-campus locations.

"For the first time, students and fans from around the world can take flight over our campus, parachute into a crowded football stadium, and navigate through our state-of-the-art classrooms and athletic facilities," said Andrew Hamilton, the Academy's chief of marketing.

Hamilton said and the virtual tour is a nod toward the Academy better serving the interests of the general public.

"The lines between communication and entertainment are increasingly blurred," he said. "We're no longer just competing with other colleges and military academics for screen-time, but also Netflix."

Several 360-degree film-shorts seen on the tour will be shown at the Academy's Planetarium for free, Monday-Friday.

U.S. AIR FORCE ACADEMY, Colo. — Cadets at the Air Force Academy have a new boss: Brig. Gen. Michele Edmondson.

Edmondson reported for duty May 31 to take on her duties as commandant of cadets and for her official assumption of command ceremony, lead by Lt. Gen. Jay Silveria, the Academy superintendent.

At the ceremony, Silveria said Edmondson's experience makes her the right officer to lead the Academy's 4,000 cadets and the 200 service members and civilians on the cadet wing's staff.

"My challenge to you is to elevate the performance of the cadet wing to even greater heights," Silveria said to Edmondson. "To ensure [cadets] are not only up to the task, but ready to outpace, out-think and outperform our adversaries in whatever mission they are called to take on."

Edmondson said she "can't wait to get started."

"My goal is providing the synergy that General Silveria needs," she told the crowd and the entire cadet wing standing in formation nearby.

Edmondson is the Academy's 29th commandant of cadets.

Before arriving at the Academy, Edmondson directed Space Policy for the National Security Council at the White House. She's earned masters' in strategic studies, national security affairs, and organizational management; and a bachelor's in aerospace engineering.

Edmondson kept her comments at the ceremony short as a nod to the cadet formation.

"Cadets, it's not lost on me that I'm the last thing standing between you and your summer leave," she said.

U.S. AIR FORCE ACADEMY, Colo. – The Air Force Academy's summer flying training operations run June 4-August 2.

Flying operations, which take place all year but increase during summer, are part of the Academy's Airmanship programs, which include soaring, powered flight and parachute operations.

Summer flying hours are Monday-Friday,7 a.m.-Sunset. There may be an additional occasional Saturday flying training day.



Airmanship programs expose cadets to the fundamentals of flying and provide leadership and character development opportunities. More than 1,000 cadets participate in the Airmanship programs during the Summer months.

This program supports the development of cadets as future officers and leaders. Nearly fifty percent of Academy's cadets are selected to attend pilot training after graduating.
