

U.S. AIR FORCE ACADEMY, Colo. — So you want to visit the Academy but don't feel like leaving home?

All you need is the internet, thanks to an interactive, 360-degree virtual tour the school launched May 1.

"Every potential cadet, family member, community member and general supporter gets an authentic, behind-the-scenes view of what the Academy is like," said Mike Peterson, the Academy's chief of outreach.

The tour can be taken with smartphones, computers, or via head-mounted display across the Gen. Benjamin O. Davis Jr. Airfield and through the remotely piloted aircraft center, the human performance lab, the Cadet Chapel, and nearly 50 other on-campus locations.

"For the first time, students and fans from around the world can take flight over our campus, parachute into a crowded football stadium, and navigate through our state-of-the-art classrooms and athletic facilities," said Andrew Hamilton, the Academy's chief of marketing.

Hamilton said and the virtual tour is a nod toward the Academy better serving the interests of the general public.

"The lines between communication and entertainment are increasingly blurred," he said. "We're no longer just competing with other colleges and military academics for screen-time, but also Netflix."

Several 360-degree film-shorts seen on the tour will be shown at the Academy's Planetarium for free, Monday-Friday.

U.S. AIR FORCE ACADEMY, Colo. – An auditorium filled with families, friends and faculty celebrated the graduation of 180 Air Force Academy Preparatory School cadet candidates May 20.

The ceremony marked the successful completion of the Prep School's 10-month curriculum.

Two-hundred-thirty-five cadet candidates were admitted into the Prep School for the 2018-2019 academic year. Of the graduates, 176 received appointments to the Academy and are scheduled to report for Basic Cadet Training in June.

Addressing the audience, Preparatory School commander, Col. Timothy W Thurston II, quoted former President Ronald Reagan when sharing his thoughts about the cadet-candidates' dedication and commitment to service.

"Freedom is never more than one generation away from extinction," he said. "We didn't pass it to our children in the bloodstream. It must be fought for, protected, and handed on for them to do the same. Or one day we will spend our sunset years telling our children and our children's children what it was once like in the United States when men were free."

Thurston added, "We are training our replacements, we had better get it right."

Cadet 1st Class Richard Evans, a 2015 Preparatory School graduate and soon-to-be second lieutenant with the Academy's 2019 graduating class, served as the keynote speaker for the ceremony.

"I remember being in your seats a mere four years ago," Evans said to the graduates. "My 10-months at the prep school were some of the finest days of my Academy career. Those 10-months are what made all the difference in my success as a cadet on the hill [the Academy].

"Every second of the next four years to come will be worth it," he continued. "At the same time, every day will demand your absolute best. That is the price we pay for choosing this profession."

The Preparatory School also honored Cadet Candidate Micah Tice by presenting him with the Preparatory School Class of 2019's very first graduation certificate.


Tice went missing when hiking in the Rocky Mountain National Park last November.

"Micah pushed not only himself but those around him to be his best," said Capt. Evan Wise, the graduation ceremony's emcee. "He was confident, headstrong and loved to compete against his peers in all areas. Micah was the real deal. The total package."

Schulte Award marks decade since namesake, Academy graduate killed in Afghanistan

U.S. AIR FORCE ACADEMY, Colo. — On May 20, 2009, 1st Lt. Roslyn 'Roz' Littmann Schulte became the first female Air Force Academy graduate to be killed in action in the Global War on Terror. Lt. Schulte and Shawn Montgomery Pine, who was at the time a contractor and retired Army lieutenant colonel, were killed when their convoy was hit by a command wire improvised explosive device.

In honor of their daughter's sacrifice and legacy, every May since 2010, Bob and Susie Schulte have made a trip to the Air Force Academy to recognize an outstanding first class cadet who embodies Schulte's "impeccable character, unwavering leadership, and spirit of service." This year's pilgrimage is especially poignant given it marks 10 years since Roz's passing.

This year's 1st Lt. Roslyn L. Schulte Cadet Award and Recognition Ceremony will host keynote speaker, retired Army Col. David Astin, who was also a member of their convoy on that fateful day and vowed to never forget the events that transpired that day, nor the sacrifice his sister and brother in arms made.

"Those of us who witnessed the tragic events vowed to never forget the sacrifice of our fallen friends," Astin said. "As part of that vow, I went to St. Louis in November 2009 — which was roughly three months after my return from Afghanistan — to meet Bob and Susie Schulte, Roz's parents. They opened their home to me, and we have been friends ever since. I would go beyond that to say I consider them to be family ... They are truly remarkable people, and their generosity of spirit never ceases to amaze me."

Roz's indomitable spirit and leadership capability was recognized then by her peers and continues to make meaningful impacts on cadets and fellow members of the profession of arms a decade on after her passing. Her father, Bob, recalled that Roz had always been a natural leader from her days in preschool coordinating parades, to her time as an inspiring teammate and leader on her lacrosse team and Wing Staff at the Academy; and finally, as an intelligence officer. Her father noted that his daughter liked to be in control and that the Academy offered her many opportunities to hone her skills as a leader. When she died, the family received hundreds of letters from those who had served with Roz. The letters noted how "she reacted to them sympathetically – not as a dictator but as a cooperator. She cared about them, she remembered where they were from... You expect to get well written letters from a general or a colonel but not a handwritten letter from the Lance Corporal who guarded the gate at Camp Eggers," BobSchulte said. "As her teammates and friends stated, 'We liked to follow Roz. We trusted her, we knew that it would be fun, and we wouldn't get in trouble."

Astin also noted Roz's continuing legacy and inspired leadership.

"The example Roz set reinforced my belief that inspirational leaders have three common

qualities: competence, commitment and caring," he said. "Roz had those qualities in abundance, and she was one of the most remarkable junior leaders I have ever known. Simply put, she inspired everyone with whom she served, and that is the true mark of a leader's success. Leaders don't divide, they bring people together. Roz continues to do that, a decade after her passing, which speaks volumes about the tremendous impact she had on those who served with her."

The community honors Roslyn's legacy at her high school, the John Burroughs School in St. Louis Missouri with a scholarship, as well as an annual Spirit Award for fun activities during the school's spirit week.

Roz was inducted into the Missouri Lacrosse Hall of Fame in 2018.

This year's annual 1st Lt Roslyn Schulte Award for Exemplary Cadet Character and Leadership will be held on 28 May in the Center for Character and Leadership, Polaris Hall, and will recognize five cadets who have been nominated for this year's award.
