Organizational awards are designed to recognize cadet units for outstanding achievement in academics, military training, athletics, and extracurricular activities. Individual awards are designed to recognize cadets for their military, academic, and athletic performance. They are offered for their motivational and inspirational value to all cadets who may one day be called upon to defend our great nation. Military awards recognize the highest standards of leadership, character development, and military scholarship. Academic awards reward outstanding achievement in each of the four academic divisions. Athletic awards are awarded to cadets who demonstrate superior athletic achievement and leadership abilities. Military Awards

The Intercollegiate Athletics Squadron Award, established in 1962, is based on participation and achievement in the intercollegiate program.

The Intramural Athletics Squadron Award (Malanaphy Trophy), established in 1956, is based on points earned in intramural athletics and is sponsored by the United Services Automobile Association, Mountain States Region, in memory of First Lieutenant John J. Malanaphy.

Athletic Excellence Squadron Award (Superintendent's Trophy), established in 1979, is presented to the squadron with the highest ranking in both intramural athletics and intercollegiate participation and is sponsored by the Association of Graduates of the United States Air Force Academy.

The Military Proficiency Squadron Award, established in 1963, recognizes the squadron achieving the highest overall military standing and is sponsored by United States Space Command in memory of Colonel John H. Fowler, Jr.

The Core Values Squadron Award, established in 2003, is based on leadership and character development through the performance of community service and is sponsored by the Airlift Tanker Association.

The Outstanding Group Award, established in 1970, is awarded for the highest achievements in military, academic and athletic excellence. It is sponsored by the Association of Graduates of the United States Air Force Academy, through donations made in memory of the following graduates who died in service to their country: Major William E. Page, Jr., Class of 1959; Captain Marvin W. Guthrie, Jr., Class of 1965; Captain Alfred R. Jacox, Jr., Class of 1965; Captain Monte L. Moorberg, Class of 1961; Captain Richard T. Morris, Class of 1964; Captain James V. Newendorp, Class of 1965; Captain Robert L. Reeves, Class of 1964; Captain James W. Wood, Class of 1965; and Lieutenant Dennis B. Haas, Class of 1968.

The Outstanding Cadet in Remotely Piloted Aircraft Award, established in 2012, is sponsored by General James P. McCarthy, USAF, Retired, and Mrs. McCarthy in memory of Captain Mark Patrick McCarthy, Class of 1985, who died when his F-16 crashed into the Adriatic Sea. Captain McCarthy had many accomplishments during his career to include Cadet Vice Wing Commander, Distinguished Graduate from Pilot Instructor Training and Squadron Officer School.

The Outstanding Cadet Honor Chairperson Award, established in 1961, is sponsored by the family of Second Lieutenant John C. K. Milligan, Class of 1959, in his memory.

The Outstanding Cadet Element Leader Award, is sponsored by the Georgia parents club, in memory of First Lieutenant Joseph D. Helton, class of '07. Lt Helton graduated with honors in leadership, academics, and athletics. He was killed in action in 2009 by an improvised explosive device detonation while deployed to Iraq with the 6th Security Forces Squadron and he earned the bronze star and purple heart.

Military Awards

The Outstanding Cadet Flight Commander Award, established in 1996, is sponsored by the Military Affairs Council of the Colorado Springs Chamber and Economic Development Corporation.

The Outstanding Cadet Squadron Commander Award, established in 1959, is sponsored by McCormick and Company, Inc., in memory of General Hoyt S. Vandenberg. General Vandenberg served as the Air Force Chief of Staff from 1948–1953.

The Outstanding Cadet Group Commander Award, established in 1959, is sponsored by the Veterans of Foreign Wars of the United States Auxiliary in memory of Major General Oscar Westover. General Westover, a 1906 West Point graduate, was Chief of Staff of the Army Air Corps from 1935 to 1938.

The names of the Cadet Wing Commanders are inscribed on plaques displayed in the Arnold Hall ballroom. The Glenn H. Curtiss Trophy is also displayed in the Arnold Hall ballroom. For twenty years, until 1941, Glenn Curtiss awarded this trophy to the winners of the Curtiss Air Races in Miami, Florida. To illustrate the transition from "fastest pilot" to the "whole person" concept, the Iron Gate Chapter of the Air Force Association reinstated this trophy to recognize the "whole persons" who serve as the Cadet Wing Commanders.

The Cadet Summer Wing Commander Award, established in 2007, is sponsored by Aviators' Post No. 743, American Legion.

The Cadet Fall Wing Commander Award, established in 1959, is sponsored by Aviators' Post No. 743, American Legion, in memory of Captain Herbert A. Adamson, Class of 1959. Captain Adamson was the Academy's first wing commander and served on active duty as a B-52 pilot with Strategic Air Command until returning to graduate school. He subsequently taught in the Academy's Department of Economics.

The Cadet Spring Wing Commander Award, established in 1959, is sponsored by Aviators' Post No. 743, American Legion, in memory of General of the Air Force Henry H. (Hap) Arnold. General Arnold was a pioneer airman who was taught to fly by the Wright Brothers. He was commander of the Army Air Forces in their victory over Germany and Japan in World War II.

The Outstanding Cadet in Citizenship Award, established in 2001, is sponsored by the Rotary Club of the Garden of the Gods to recognize involvement in community support activities.

The Outstanding Cadet in Character Award, established in 2007, is sponsored by the Association of Graduates of the United States Air Force Academy.

The Outstanding Cadet in Military Performance Award, established in 1966, is sponsored by the family and friends of General Walter C. Sweeney, Jr., in his memory. General Sweeney commanded the Army Task Force Group at the Battle of Midway during World War II and also took part in General Curtis LeMay's famous B-29 low level night attacks against Japan.

Argentine Air Force Award (Outstanding Cadet in the Order of Graduation) is sponsored by the Argentine Air Force. A saber symbolizing the virtues of General San Martin is presented to the cadet graduating first in the class.

The Chilean Air Force Award (Outstanding Cadet in the Order of Graduation) is sponsored by the Chilean Air Force. The Chilean Air Force Medal is presented to the cadet graduating first in the class.

The Mexican Secretariat of Defense presentation is a replica of a hilted saber from the late eighteen century and was used by General Jose Maria Morelos during the battle of Cuautla in 1812.

The Outstanding Cadet in the Order of Graduation Award was established in 1959 and is sponsored by the Order of Daedalians in memory of Lieutenant Generals Millard F. Harmon and Hubert R. Harmon, founding members of the Order of Daedalians. General Millard Harmon was commander of US Army Air Forces in the South Pacific from 1942 until his aircraft crashed at sea near the Marshall Islands in 1945. General Hubert Harmon commanded combat air units in World War II and later served with the United Nations. He was recalled from retirement by President Eisenhower to serve as the Academy's first superintendent.

The name of the Outstanding Cadet in the Order of Graduation is inscribed on the Academy's 100-Year Honor Roll located in the Arnold Hall ballroom. The Honor Roll plaque was donated by Kelly Field National Bank, San Antonio, Texas, in memory of Lieutenant Generals Millard F. and Hubert R. Harmon.
