Access to USAFA

The US Air Force Academy is open to visitors from 0530 to 2200 via the North Gate entrance (Exit 156). All visitors to USAFA must present a valid ID (CAC, drivers license, passport etc.) to enter the base and you may be subject to a vehicle search. Vehicle transportation is highly recommended, as the large USAFA reservation is not easily walkable.

Directions to Polaris Hall and Parking

The 2024 SWC Symposium will be held in the Polaris Hall Forum. Polaris Hall is located adjacent the Cadet Area, and is bracketed by Arnold Hall and the Cadet Chapel.

To reach Polaris Hall, enter USAFA via North Gate and continue on North Gate Blvd which eventually becomes Academy Dr. You will pass the Athletic Overlook, with numerous athletic fields on your left side. Following a sweeping left turn to parallel the mountains, turn left on Cadet Dr. Polaris Hall's glass obelisk will be clearly recognizable ahead of you. Parking instructions:

All Attendees: Proceed forward, turning left to park in the lot next to the Planetarium. Parking is free and no passes are required. Walk toward Arnold Hall, then proceed forward to the Polaris Hall entrance. Symposium staff will be waiting to greet you at the registration desk.

Distinguished Visitors: Proceed forward on Cadet Dr. towards the white access gates. Symposium staff will be waiting to greet you and direct you to parking in front of Arnold Hall. Marked signs will indicate individual Distinguished Visitor (DV) parking spots. Your party will be greeted at curbside and escorted to the symposium area and DV facilities.




USAFA Dining Options

Weather at USAFA

USAFA is located at the foot of the Rocky Mountain Front Range and April weather can vary widely. Temperatures can range from below freezing to 60° F in April, with very strong winds. We highly recommend bringing an appropriate jacket, based upon forecasted temperature and weather conditions. We are located at 7,258 ft and also advise sunscreen and a reusable water bottle to help limit the affects of high altitude and the dry climate.

Weather Delays and Closures

Temperatures and snow will not normally impede operations at USAFA. However, severe weather does occasionally cause delayed reporting or a base closure.
