She is also a retired United States Air Force Reserve Lieutenant Colonel, where she proudly served 15 years as an Admissions Liaison Officer for the U.S. Air Force Academy and the Air Force Reserve Officers Training Corps.



Mission

United States Air Force Academy (USAFA) Admissions Liaison Officers (ALOs) evaluate, mentor, identify, and attract candidates for USAFA and/or applicants for AF Reserve Officer Training Corps (AFROTC). The ALO Program strives to provide the Air Force with the best qualified and most motivated students available.

Responsibilities



 Conduct virtual interviews with assigned candidates; insightful and objective evaluations ensure candidates possess appropriate character and leadership potential and compatible motivation to serve in the Air Force

Mentor

. Answer questions applicants have on USAFA academic, military, athletic, & airmanship programs

- · Prepare candidates for their evaluations
- . Discuss what it means to be an officer in the Air Force



- · Conduct outreach and recruiting activities
- · Visit local schools & talk with counselors, teachers, and students about USAFA/AFROTC opportunities
- · Attend Service Academy informational events hosted by local Congressional offices . Represent USAFA at STEM and aviation activities, Total Force events, college fairs, etc.

Expectations + Eligibility

Primary Duty (PD) ALO

- Belief in the USAFA mission
- . Cat-E Reservists in the Participating Individual Ready Reserve (PIRR)
- . Only military position (cannot hold an AD, IMA, TR, or Guard position at the same time)
- · Earn points toward AF Retirement
- · No drill/annual tour requirements
- Larger time commitment expected
- · Must maintain readiness at all times
- Not eligible for Tricare Prime
- · Cannot transfer GI Bill benefits
- Compete for promotion in Primary AFSC competitive category
- · Applicants must have sustained exemplary record of performance
- Applicants must meet requirements in DAFMAN 36-2032 chapter 8.3. including
- ✓ Rank of O-2 to O-5
- ✓ Less than 18 years of service
- ✓ Not in a failed promotion status
- ✓ Not have a Mandatory Separation Date (MSD) established
- ✓ Agree to serve at least 2 years in the role
- ✓ Not involved in public/private activities that conflict or reflect negatively on the AF, USAFA, AFROTC, or ALO program

Additional Duty (AD) ALO

- · Belief in the USAFA mission
- Volunteer status
- · Individuals may be Active Duty, Reserve, Guard, retired, or civilian
- · Military:
- ✓ Sustained exemplary record of performance √ 0-2 or higher
- ✓ Must not be assigned to USAFA or AFROTC
